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Did You Know? Myths About Home Health Care



Myth: Home health care is only for older adults. **Reality:** Every year we serve about 2,750 central Vermonters of all ages, including moms and their babies, healthy adults in need of medical or therapy support after a hospital stay or surgery, those nearing the end of life, and everyone in between.

Myth: You must be bed-bound to qualify for care. **Reality:** If Medicare is your primary insurance provider, you must meet Medicare's home-bound criteria. This means that leaving home requires "considerable and taxing effort." You can still go to church or get a haircut. If you have Medicaid or private insurance like BCBS, there's no home-bound criteria or age qualification.

Myth: Your doctor must initiate care. **Reality:** You are your best advocate. Start by talking to your doctor. If you need a little help starting this conversation, call CVHHH to speak with a home health specialist.

Celebrating Our Hospice Community

November is National Hospice & Palliative Care Month. All month long we are celebrating our community of hospice caregivers: a group which includes members of CVHHH's hospice team, hospice volunteers, our hospice medical director, and the families of individuals served by hospice.

We partnered with photographer Corey Hendrickson and National Life Group to bring these caregiver stories to the community through photographs and personal reflection.

For two years, Corey photographed 17 hospice caregivers, clinicians, and volunteers outside of work. They are at home, in nature and with their families or beloved pets. "When my grandmother died, I received help from several hospice volunteers. I was moved by their willingness just to be there and wanted to use my art to explore the ways that hospice caregivers recharge and reflect on their profession," says Corey.

National Life Group generously donated space in its Montpelier headquarters where the portraits will be on display through the end of November.
