

Central Vermont Home Health & Hospice (CVHHH) is a full service 501(c)(3) not-for-profit Visiting Nurse Association (VNA) that has served 23 towns in Washington and Orange Counties since 1911. CVHHH is committed to providing high-quality, medically necessary home health, hospice, and maternal-child health care to all central Vermonters regardless of ability to pay. CVHHH also offers public foot care and flu clinics, private care, and long-term care services (homemaker and personal care attendant support) for clients and families at home.

2019 Underpayment of Care As a not-for-profit organization, we are guided by a mission to offer all central Vermonters equal access to care. This means that, in some cases, we provide care to individuals regardless of their ability to pay. In 2019, our nurses, therapists, aides, and social workers provided \$760,292 in care for which we were not fully reimbursed by Medicare, Medicaid, third-party private insurance companies, or by the patient and their families. We rely on fundraising and town funding to make up this difference.

Staff and Volunteers

At any given time in 2019, CVHHH employed 180 administrative and clinical staff and relied on the service of about 130 volunteers. Half of these volunteers support the Hospice team. Volunteers also provide administrative support in the office, with our health promotion nurse (at foot-care clinics), and at our three major fundraising events, the Chez Henri Cup, Hospice Memorial Golf Tournament, and Seasons of Life Fashion Show and Dinner.
